AVE J COMMUNITY GARDEN

Our 1st Community Garden was established in the Summer of 2020 on an empty lot owned by Board of Directors member, Louie Minor, who donated a 2 year lease.



KELLY FLADING COMMUNITY GARDEN

Our 2nd Community Garden was created in the Spring of 2021 on land purchased by our co-founder, Kelly Flading. She donated the land to Killeen Creators prior to her passing in June, and her garden has been maintained since, in honor of her Vision.



THE ALVAREZ COMMUNITY GARDEN

Our 3rd Community Garden was established in September of 2021 with a 5 year donated lease from Ramon Alvarez - of his family's homestead on the corner of Atkinson and N. 18th Street.

In Spring of 2020 Kelly Flading and our other founding board members planted the first seeds for our first community garden in response to the closing of two grocery stores and North Killeen becoming a food desert.

Kelly envisioned a network of community gardens where neighbors worked side by side planting, tending, and harvesting healthy food. No gates. No locks. No fees. As important as the food, Kelly believed, is imparting trust and hope. Those seeds and Killeen Creators quickly grew with the help of dozens of donors and volunteers coming together to create 3 Community Gardens in North Killeen!

Tragically, we lost Kelly, our co-founder, in June to cancer. But our community continues to come together to make sure the seeds she planted are watered and tended and stewarded into the full-grown Vision she shared just months before.

We all plant SEEDS every day, with every thought, word, and action we take. We have influence. Pay attention, and you'll see - what you nurture, grows, and, you CAN make a difference. You matter.

In 2022 we will continue to plant seeds and grow our gardens and our community. With your help, together, we will establish gardens 4 & 5 and launch the ART of Recovery to help neighbors with PTSD grow from survivors into thrivers! Thank you to all who have and will contribute to Kelly's Dream.


Over 300 Families served!
